One of our functions as a division is to be the counterpart organization in Canada of the International Association of Volcanology and Chemistry of the Earth's Interior (IAVCEI) which is a member-society of the International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics (IUGG). The committee which represents the IUGG in Canada is the Canadian National Committee for IUGG (CNC/IUGG) and we have the responsibility to nominate one member to this committee to represent volcanology. The term is normally the period between successive IUGG meetings, i.e. about 4 years.

Annual Meeting (Toronto) which is also the occasion for our annual meetings, 5 positions are up for election; Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary-Treasurer, Counsellor for Eastern Canada, and Economic Geology Representative.
